## What is being rezoned?

Property along the Blue Line corridor recommended for transit oriented development in a City Council-adopted transit station area plan will be recommended to be rezoned to one of the following districts:

- TOD-UC (Urban Center)
- TOD-CC (Community Center)
- TOD-NC (Neighborhood Center) TOD-TR (Transition)

#### What will not be rezoned?

Any parcel zoned UMUD, or having Conditional or Optional urban zoning (e.g. MUDD), or in Uptown inside the I-277/I-77 loop, will not be rezoned as part of this initiative.

## When will this happen?

The City plans to file a rezoning petition on July 22, 2019. This will be followed by a City Council public hearing in early fall and a City Council decision shortly thereafter. The new TOD zoning will go into effect at once if approved by City Council.
